



Ayhan İrfanoğlu is a Professor and Associate Head of Civil Engineering in Lyles School of Civil Engineering at Purdue University, in Indiana, USA. He received BSCE from the Middle East Technical University in 1993 and MSCE and Ph.D. from the California Institute of Technology, the USA, in 1994 and 2000. Dr. İrfanoğlu was employed as an engineering consultant at WJE Associates before starting his tenure at Purdue University in 2005. His teaching and research interests include earthquake engineering, structural dynamics and modeling, engineering seismology, and structural analysis. He did earthquake field reconnaissance after the 1994 Northridge, 1999 Kocaeli, 2003 Bingöl, 2010 Haiti, 2011 Van, 2016 Taiwan, and 2018 Mexico earthquakes. Dr. İrfanoğlu is an associate editor of the American Society of Civil Engineers Journal of Performance of Constructed Facilities and the Frontiers in Built Environment. He is a member of the Earthquake Engineering Association of Turkey, the Earthquake Engineering Research Institute (USA), the American Concrete Institute, the American Society of Civil Engineers, and the Seismological Society of America.
